* The course will be held between 18th–29th July 1983 at the University of East Anglia and is aimed at those who are professionally concerned with practical problems of local refugee resettlement in developing countries.

* The following topics will be addressed:

A. Background Issues

- Legal definitions and their application.
- Historical analysis as a means of explanation.
- Economic, social and perception difference in a refugee community.
- Integration versus assimilation.

B. Intervention

- Special problems in repatriation.
- The use of information as a basis for intervention.
- The general environment and the economic opportunities. Rapid Survey Techniques.
- The investment risk — ecological factors.
- Project evaluation and monitoring.
- Management models and methodologies.
- Feasibility studies and evaluation procedures.

* Teaching methods will include: Lectures, seminars, discussion, case studies, visual aids. Each participant will be provided with a background briefing pack and a certificate of attendance on completion of the course.
