chiefs under the coordination of local development officers in the respective districts to assess the actual extent of damage caused by recent floods and landslides.

Meanwhile, the Health Ministry has put the latest flood and landslide death toll at 886 and that of the missing at 947. Two hundred and ten have been injured.

In other development Minister of State for Health Dr. Ram Baran Yadav today set out for the inspection tour of flood and landslide affected areas of Narayani and Janakpur zones today.

Minister Dr. Yadav will inquire about the health condition of the affected people and give necessary directives to the health workers working in the areas.

He is accompanied by senior doctors and health practitioners.

Meanwhile, 905 k.g. of additional medicines and 3,000 k.g. of bleaching powder has also been dispatched to the areas, according to the national health education, information and communication centre.

Similarly a report from Palung adds a team of volunteers including three doctors arrived yesterday after two days' walk for the treatment of the landslide and flood-affected people in Palung area of Makwanpur district. The team has brought some medicines and clothes also.

The team that includes Dr. Indira Shrestha, Dr. Mahesh Maskey, Dr. Krishna Giri and volunteers Basanti Maskey and Krishna Gopal Karanjit will stay for one week.

The team included Hiranya Lal Shrestha MP also.
