

PROFESSIONAL PROFILE

Katherine Reid, Regional Program Officer, USAID/OFDA/LAC

Katherine Reid joined the USAID/OFDA/LAC team as a program officer in August 2011, following more than 10 years of experience in international development and relief work. She is also the USAID/OFDA regional focal point for the incorporation of gender into overall programming.

She began her overseas work in 1995 in the Balkans, monitoring food aid distributions for the U.N. World Food Program in Serbia and managing a conflict-resolution program for the U.N. Development Program in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In 1999, Katherine joined a USAID-funded civil society development program with Counterpart International in Belarus. She later returned to the United States to work with a partner organization coordinating early intervention services for special needs children. In 2003, Katherine returned to overseas work with a Mercy Corps program that provided health and water/sanitation services to Afghan refugees in Balochistan Province, Pakistan. In 2005, she moved to Sudan to design, launch, and manage the International Rescue Committee's child protection program in South, West, and eventually North Darfur, and then went on to manage the organization's refugee resettlement program in Phoenix, Arizona.

Katherine has a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Emmanuel College in Boston, Massachusetts, and a Master's degree in Philosophy (Peace Studies) from Trinity College Dublin, Ireland.
